Highlights of the museum include a series of time tunnels reconstructing critical periods in the city's history, including traditional village life, British rule and modern times. This is a great museum to get a handle on what makes Hong Kong tick and how the city defied geography and common sense to become one of the world's largest metropolises. Known as the nation's father, Sun had close ties to Hong Kong, including his years in high school and university. It was during his stay in the city that he began to cook up his plans to overthrow the imperial Chinese government. The museum holds a somewhat dry collection of personal items, photographs and reconstructed scenes, but it is also located at the heart of the Sun Yat Sen. trail a tour of historic buildings related to sen. The main pull here is the setting, which is the beautifully preserved, 100-year-old Lei Yue Mun fortress. The exhibits inside are a very decent selection of uniforms, maps and weapons that trace Hong Kong's military history from the beginning of the Ming period through British Hong Kong and the arrival of the PLA. Arguably the best-known exhibition focuses on the little-known battle for Hong Kong - the brutal World War II battle for the city with Japanese forces. His collection of Chinese antiques is perhaps the museum's most impressive exhibition, where you'll find everything from traditional ceramics and glassware to mandarins and bamboo sculptures. The museum also houses a Chinese fine arts exhibition, an extensive calligraphy collection and an interesting section dedicated to Hong Kong art spanning over 100 years.
